FOREWORD

MAC will organise three Sprints during 2015: two at MIRA and one event at Curborough. In addition the MAC will co-promote two Sprint events with Chester Motor Club at the Ty Croes Circuit on Anglesey. These events will be on consecutive days using different circuits.

Championships that we shall be welcoming to one or more events include the SBD Motorsport British Sprint Championship (National A), the Service Hydraulics Speed Championship 2015, the SBD/H.S.A. Speed Championship, the BARC SBD Speed Championship, the WSCC Northampton Motorsport Speed Series, the MSCC Techniques Speed Championship, the Paul Matty Sports Cars Lotus Championship, the Ferrari Owners' Club Hill Climb Championship, the SSOC Speed Championship, the 201 500 Owners' Association Sprint Championship, the Austin Healey Club 'Healeysport' Championship, the Sevenoaks Speed League 2015, the 2015 Chester and Liverpool Motor Clubs Speed Championship, the A.N.W.C.C. Sprint Championship, the Lancashire Automobile Club Speed Championship, the SD34 MSG Championship and the L&CCC/Keyline Championship 2015.

Please note that MIRA is not a spectator event, and there is no public admission to this venue. Competitors and mechanics will require advance passes in order to obtain admission to the site. **No persons under 12 years of age are allowed into MIRA.**

ENTRY PROCEDURE

All entries will be held in abeyance for consideration by the Selection Committee immediately after the closing date, and notification of acceptance or refusal will be posted within ten days of the closing date for each event. Competitors requiring confirmation of receipt of entries should include a stamped addressed envelope with their entry. Entry fees will be banked as received. Entries cancelled 12 days or more prior to the meeting will be refunded in full less a £15.00 administration charge. Entries cancelled between 5 and 11 days prior to the meeting will be refunded in full less a £35.00 administration charge. Entries cancelled less than 5 days prior to the meeting, may be refunded MSA per capita charges only, upon application to the Secretary of the Meeting.

Entries accompanied by post-dated cheques will not be considered.

Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organisers, as long as the event is not over subscribed, and subject to a late entry fee of £15.00 being paid

Our preferred method of entering is online, but we will also accept paper and fax entries provided that they are received before the time laid down for the closing of entries, together with entry fees, in line with MSA Regulations.

- 1. The Midland Automobile Club (Est. 1901) Limited will organise Sprints at Curborough, near Lichfield, Staffs and MIRA near Nuneaton, Warks. The Club will also organise Sprint events at Ty Croes Anglesey Circuit co-promoted with the Chester Motor Club and incorporating the Basil Davenport Memorial Trophy Sprint and the Dave Moore Memorial Trophy Sprint, as set out in the preceding Summary of Events.
- 2. The meetings will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd., (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA); these Supplementary Regulations; and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

3. MSA Permits as specified in the Summary have been applied for.
The events are open to competitors in the Championships specified in the Summary of Events, members of the organising clubs or members of the invited Clubs listed below.

- 5. All competitors must produce a valid Competition Licence, Club Membership Card or Championship Registration Card (if applicable).
- 6. The events are round of the Championships specified in the Summary.
- 7. The programme of the meetings will be:

Scrutineering starts at 8.30 a.m. (8.00 a.m. Anglesey).

Any competitor not signed on by 10.30 a.m. may be excluded.

Drivers briefing at 9.00 a.m. (all drivers should attend).

Practice commences at 9.30 a.m.

Competitive runs commence 45 minutes after the end of practice.

The first two competitive runs count towards results.

At MIRA and Curborough a third non-scoring run may be given at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, weather and time permitting.

- 8. Particulars of the Courses are as under:
 - (a) Curborough is 900 yards long and consists of a smooth tarmac surface with left and right-hand corners and a fast finishing straight.
 - (b) MIRA course comprises part of the Dunlop Handling Circuit having a Delugrip surface with fast left hand bends and a right/left complex at just over half distance leading to a straight and final left-hand bend. The length is approximately 1,860 yards.
 - (c) Anglesey the single lap International circuit 1.9 miles consisting of 4 left hand corners and 5 right hand corners.
 - (d) Anglesey dual lap National circuit 2 miles consisting of 4 left hand corners and 8 right hand corners
- 9. The events will run to the following standard classes:

Entries made on behalf of a driver less than 18 years of age must be made on an entry form obtained from the MAC office. Entries may be made online through the MAC website.

Entries close at 10.00 a.m. on the day shown, or **before** if it is fully subscribed.

- 13. The maximum entry plus 10 reserves is 100 at Curborough, 120 at MIRA, 130 at Anglesey on 13th June and 90 at Anglesey on 14th June. The minimum entry at Curborough and MIRA is 70, 13th June Anglesey is 100 and 14th June Anglesey 65. The minimum for each class is 5. Should either of the above minimum figures not be reached, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entry fees may be refunded as detailed in the foreword to this document.
- 14. **Reserves** Entries which are accepted as reserves will be so indicated in the Provisional entry list, together with the order that they may be brought in to replace non-starters from the competitors listed in the printed programme. All reserves will be given practice and those who are not brought in to run in the event will be made a refund of the entry fee paid less £60.00. The reserves to run in the event will be notified by the end of practice.

- 15. Officials of the meeting will be notified to competitors in their Final Instructions, and published in the event programme. Any changes will be notified on the meeting notice board.
- 16. Provisional Results will be published as soon as possible following the end of each event.
- 17. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with MSA Regulations.
- 18. Starting order will be as shown in the Programme. Cars will start singly. The starting signal will be a green light. Method of timing will be electronic, activated by the vehicle breaking a light beam. A timing strut in accordance with S.10.9 is required. The finish line will be indicated by chequered boards.
- 19. Competitors will have the opportunity of walking the course before practice, and will be allowed two practice runs. At Anglesey on 14th June two laps of the National Circuit constitutes two practice runs. Additional practice runs may be allowed at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, time and weather permitting.
- 20. Competitors will be identified by competition numbers in accordance with MSA regulations. These will not be provided by the organisers.
- 21. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General Regulations except as modified below:
 - S.9.5.4 If all four wheels leave the tarmac surface or marked boundary no time will be recorded.
 - S.9.6 The timekeeper in charge at the start line shall be the Judge of Fact in respect of false starts.

 At all events the Chief Section Marshal at each post will be the Judge of Fact in respect of a car leaving the course or taking the wrong course.

The Environmental/Noise Scrutineer will be the judge of fact in noise related matters.

- 22. All vehicles must comply with the Silencing regulations of J.5.17 Sound testing may be carried out.
- 23. Cars Running in Roadgoing classes must run in a road legal condition. Competitors must be able to produce proof of current road tax, insurance and MOT certificate. Proof of road tax will be via VED Tax Disc, Taxation Receipt or vehicle enquiry print out using the DVLA enquiry web site. Competitors will also be required to provide the vehicle registration number on the entry form.
- 24, Tyres must comply with S.11.6.2 list 1a or list 1b. Tyres for cars running in championships must comply with the championship rules.
- 25. The use of any external device or power source to pre-heat the tyres of a competing car, whether the tyres are fitted to the car or not, is prohibited.
- 26. **On board cameras.** Vehicles can only carry cameras if authorised by the Chief Scrutineer (J5.20.5). Mountings will be closely inspected. Please indicate on your entry form if you intend to compete with a camera fitted.
- 27. Electric and hybrid cars should carry a sign adjacent to competition numbers (J5.14.8)
- 28. No competing car may leave the site during an event without permission of the Clerk of the course. Roadgoing cars must remove or cover competition numbers before going on the public highway.
- 29. Animals will not be admitted.

30. All other MSA General and Technical Regulations apply as written. All references are to the 2015 Yearbook.

NOTES FOR ANGLESEY EVENTS

Camping at the circuit is permitted at no charge providing that the organisers have been notified in advance.

Food - Hot and cold food is available at the Circuit during the day.

Fuel - is not available at the circuit but available at Valley Junction A5 and A5025 (daytime).
